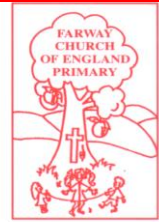

Dear Parents,

Well, it's a new dawn, it's a new day, it's a new week at Farway, and we're feeling good!

Thanks to yet even more glorious weather this week, we have managed to take most of our learning outside again. From our daily physical activity sessions, Maths learning, Art workshops and Science, the children have embraced the outdoor learning opportunities with terrific enthusiasm.

Key Stage 1 children have continued to focus on writing their thank you letters, by looking closely at the format and features of an informal letter to someone you know and how to address an envelope. The children have collaborated confidently to generate a set of instructions to write a letter and even started to create a checklist of letter writing skills you would expect to see in a well written letter. Explain to someone at home the first thing you need to do when you write a letter to someone you already know.

'Women in Science' is the new text for Key Stage Two's present literacy focus. The pupils have spent time carefully researching key facts about some of these famous women and presented their findings as short speeches to each other and the rest of the school. Working in pairs, they had to collaborate together to consider how they might only share the most important details and information, as their speeches were on a set time limit of only thirty seconds! Don't forget to bring in any biographies from home for us to look at please, so we might make comparisons between different writing styles and text features, for our own class biography writing task at the end of this unit.

In Maths, the children in Key Stage One have been correctly identifying and describing the properties of 2-D shapes. Armed only with spaghetti and giant marshmallows, the children were faced with the challenge of constructing their own 2-D shapes. By calculating the number of spaghetti sticks and marshmallows required, the children were soon able to confidently describe the number of sides and corners of the 2-D shapes they'd made. Some of us even managed to skip to the spicier challenges, by attempting to construct a 3-D shape. Eventually though, and it was only a matter of time really, most of us gave into the temptation and decided to taste test the yummy marshmallows!



For Key Stage 2, identifying 3-D shapes from 2-D representations, has been their focus this week. Can you remember what this actually means? Explain to someone at home what is meant by 2-D representations on 3-D shapes and give an example of a 3-D shape where 2-D shapes have been represented. The children have also been looking at the nets of 3-D shapes and then attempting to construct the 3-D shape using spaghetti and mini marshmallows. Which clues in the shape net helped you to realise the 3-D shape you needed to construct? How many nets do you think you could create for a cube and how could you set about to prove there are no more to be found?

To further demonstrate all their shape knowledge and understanding, the whole school spent time outside collectively applying their 2-D and 3-D shape facts, by using the nature around them to help build and construct their shapes. It was tremendous to hear their rich mathematical vocabulary and witness such resourcefulness between all year groups. From tying knots to secure the edges of cubes or triangular prisms to create vertices, to stripping leaves from branches and cutting them to size for accurate shape side proportions, the pupils proved that once again they have great growth mind-sets and dedicated determination to succeed.

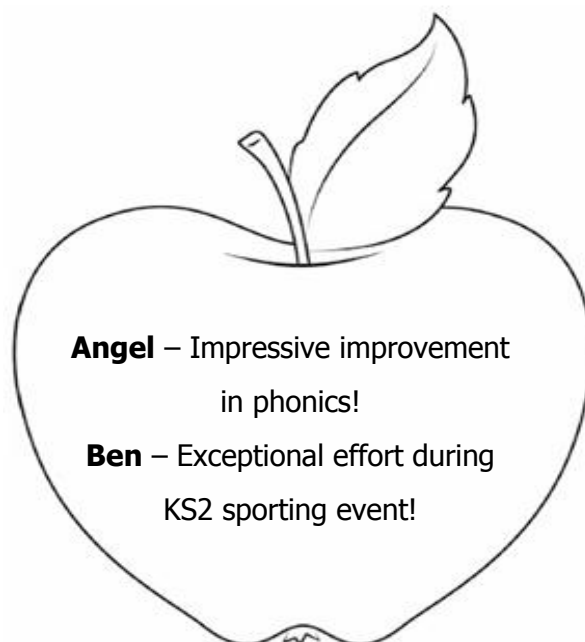

Collective Worship Activity

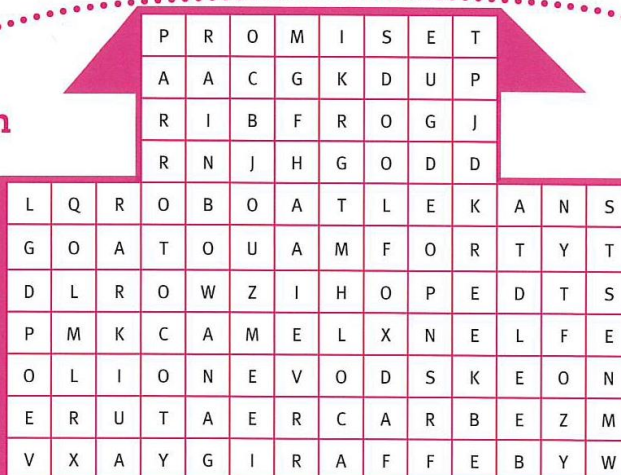
