You may remember that some of our pupils entered the Livery Dole colouring competition earlier this year. Well, on Tuesday we had a visit from Livery Dole Mitsubishi to notify us that Andrew, Issy and Charlie had been placed  $1^{\text{st}}$   $2^{\text{nd}}$  and  $3^{\text{rd}}$  respectively and each were presented with some book vouchers. Well done to the three of you. The school is also a winner and has been awarded £100 from Livery Dole.

This week the children have been continuing to work on explanation texts. Key stage 1 have been focusing on sentence work (rehearse it, write it, check and edit it), whilst key stage 2 have been looking

at the structure of paragraphs in their explanation writing.

In maths, year 1 have been looking at doubling and halving as well as counting in twos whilst year 2 have been doing some scaling work based on recipes and working out how much they need for different numbers of people. Key stage 2 have been applying their tables knowledge for multiplication using the grid method and moving towards the formal method for multiplying by 2 digit numbers.

The children have also been thinking about Remembrance Day and learning parts for the poem that they performed in the service. Many thanks to everyone who attended the Farway Remembrance Service this morning. I'm sure you will agree that the children were brilliant. A true credit to our school.

Congratulations to Charlie who was our Orchard Aims winner last week and to the Killerton Sharp Green team who lead the team point competition, however, the Tom Putt Reds aren't far behind and the Luccombe Pine Yellows have been the top scorers over the past three weeks and are catching up fast after a slow start.

Our Fledglings this week have been having fun at the Vets in the Role-play corner and have been using the light box to view animal skeleton x-rays.

Jesus wanted us to understand that however much money, or whatever talents or abilities we have been given, we each have a **responsibility** to make the most of these things, otherwise we risk losing them altogether.
