


Farway Church of England Primary School

Dear Parents,

Since our last newsletter we have had two new families join our school. We would like to extend a warm welcome to Liam and Maryanne in Class Two, Clyde in Class One and Olivia in Nursery. It has been lovely to have some new faces around school and the children have settled in very quickly.

Class 1 started this very busy month with a visit to Axe Valley Wildlife Park. The children had a fabulous time finding out some interesting facts about animals. This inspired their writing of a non-chronological report in Literacy. Mrs Jackson was extremely impressed by how brave all the children were. They volunteered themselves to handle a variety of different animals, including Charlie the Armadillo.



In Maths, the children have been consolidating their understanding of addition and subtraction. For Children in Need all the children enjoyed sorting and counting a box of smarties, then decorating their biscuits to display number bonds to 20.



On the 20th November, Farway relaunched the Jubilee Federation Vision statement, *'Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire'*. The children re-explored this vision through; discussion, artwork and writing, by asking themselves who they thought God meant them to be and why. They took part in various creative activities to further explore this idea. They created a Modroc model of themselves, designed a stained glass window for the prayer area in their room classroom and produced a wonderful book of writing called 'Who God meant me to be'. This book will be displayed on the Vision wall beside the library, so please do come and have a look at the children's fabulous ideas.



Recently, Class 1 has begun to explore playing Recorders. All the children have really enjoyed this and have displayed real musical talent. In light of this, Mrs Jackson will be starting a Recorder club on a Friday lunch time, to teach Class 1 the beginner skills of Recorder and how to read music. If you would be happy for your child to take part in this, please let Mrs Jackson know.



It has been a busy month at Farway for Class 2. They have completed their reports on farming in Devon and are now expanding their descriptive repertoire with the help of the picture book 'Window' by Jeannie Baker. In Maths, there has been a push to use Times Table Rockstars to reinforce their learning of multiplication and division facts. A quick and accurate recall of these facts is incredibly useful in other areas of Maths, avoiding the need to work out every calculation. Year Five are now using their facts to work out the area of 2D shapes. Please encourage your children to keep practising to keep skills sharp when they have internet time at home.

This half term's 'Ready, Steady, Write!' was a great success. The children enjoyed learning the famous Devon folk song 'Widcombe Fair', with Uncle Tom Cobby and all. After a morning of singing, making music, creating simple puppets and masks and identifying key events in the story; Class 2 then wrote about the events from the perspective of one of the characters in the song (or their wife). The day was complete when the whole school came together to sing the song with the help of their puppets and masks.



During this months' forest school session, the children made a willow sculpture of an Angel, which is currently part of an Angel Art Exhibition which is taking place at Exeter Cathedral this December.



The exhibition will end on 3rd January and we hope as many of you as possible will get to be able to visit to see our angel sculpture. If you're in Exeter during December, please check it out. The willow for this sculpture was kindly donated by Windrush Willow. In return for the willow they have asked for us to hold a collection to support a Guide Dog charity. If you are able to make a small donation we would be very grateful.



Start of the School Day

A polite reminder that children should be dropped off at school **from** 8.40am, so that they have plenty of time to arrive in the classroom and be ready to learn for 9am. It is useful for children to arrive at 8.40am as they are then able to settle and prepare themselves for learning. The register is taken at 9am, if your child arrives after this time they may be marked as late. Staff can only be responsible for children from 8.40am, so we would appreciate it if the children do not arrive before then. For nursery children the day starts at 9am. **If you are running late, and are due to arrive after 9am, please do let the school know.** We order our school meals first thing and need to make sure every child is catered for. We appreciate your help with this.

Sharing Assembly

Each week on a Friday afternoon we are holding a sharing assembly to celebrate the children's learning. Parents are welcome to join us from 3.10pm each week. We look forward to seeing you there.

Parking

A reminder that due to health and safety concerns there should be no parking on the driveway or bus layby outside of school in the morning or evening **unless by prior arrangement with Mrs Gray or Mr Hughes.** Occasionally we will grant special provision to parents with a large number of small children or to parents of children with special needs.
