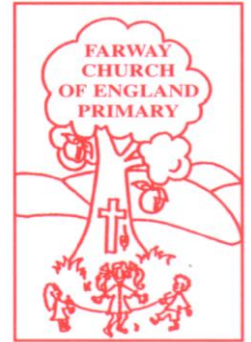

Dear Parents,

Well, the sun has continued to be out and the sky has continued to be blue and the children at Farway have carried on having another brilliant week too!

'Daisy, Daisy, give me your answer do!' is the song we've all been eagerly singing this week after our enjoyable Ready Steady Write day. The children have shown incredible collaboration during their mixed, and same age group, activities.

After listening to the original 1894 phonograph recording of 'Daisy Bell' composed by Harry Dacre, the children attempted to join in, by singing the familiar tune. There were many interesting words and phrases some of us had not heard of before, in the original song lyrics. Can you remember what a tandem is?

To start the day off, the children headed outside to the PE shed. Their paired challenge was to construct a 'bicycle built for two!' In no time at all we quickly saw wheels and pedals being carefully constructed alongside seats and handle bars. Some of the children went even further by adding a chain, suspension, a basket and a bell. The imagination, creativity and technical language displayed was tremendous! How inventive you all are!



After returning back inside the classrooms, the children learnt different action songs about bikes, and cycle safety. KS2's overall writing outcome for the day was to create an information guide, for staying safe on a bike. The pupils worked methodically to recall the key features of an information text and to identify and plan their own format. Titles, sub-headings, paragraphs, bullet points, technical vocabulary and information were a priority on their success criteria. Some of the children also chose to add questions or top tips for their guides.

After singing a selection of bicycle songs and thinking of their own actions to follow, KS1 children studied the different parts of a bike and what they're used for. They then began to create a story map based on a bicycle adventure. Linked to their present literacy unit of Farmer Duck, many children chose to write about the adventures of a duck on his bike! Where did the duck ride and who did he see on his adventures?

The day came to a celebratory close with a lovely sharing session between all pupils, showcasing all their hard work and the processes undertaken that day. Do look out for the display which will be created to show the learning processes undertaken and the successes of the day and the incredible effort from all the children in their themed writing event day.

Next week is National Anti-bullying Week. In school, we will be planning a range of activities to support the children in their thinking about how they can help to combat bullying in their own lives and the lives of those around them. The theme of this year's anti-bullying campaign is "All Equal, All Different" and we hope that it will be a celebration of the children's individuality and uniqueness. In celebration of uniqueness and individuality, we will be taking part in the anti-bullying Alliance's "Odd Socks Day". We are inviting children to wear odd socks to school on Monday 13th November, to celebrate their own unique special-ness.

Also as next Friday is Children in Need, we will be celebrating by asking the children to come to school wearing inventive, decorated 'Pudsey' Ears. Donations of £1 towards children in need will be gratefully received.

HALL OF FAME

Lady Justice

Lady **Justice** is one of the most famous landmarks in London. It is a bronze statue that stands on the domed roof of the Old Bailey.

This building houses the central criminal courts where people who are accused of breaking the law are tried by a judge and jury to find out if they are 'guilty' and should be punished or 'not guilty' and can go free.

Lady **Justice** was designed to be a symbol of **justice**: in her left hand she carries the scales of truth and fairness and in her right hand a double edged sword representing the power of reason and **justice**.
